



- To make a singular noun show possession or ownership, add an **apostrophe** and an **s**. (bird --- bird's). In other words, one bird and it "owns" something.
- To make a plural noun show possession or ownership, add an **apostrophe** after the **s**. (girls--- girls'). In other words something "belongs" to several girls.
- If the plural noun does not end in s, add an **apostrophe** and an **s** just as you would for a singular noun. (children -- - children's).
