



Capitalize:

- The first word in every sentence.
- The names of people and pets.
- The word I.
- The names of relatives like Mother and Father when they are used as a name or with another name. (When will Mother come home? Or Did Uncle John call?)
- Names of days, months, holidays, places and nationalities.
- Titles of respect such as: Doctor, Judge, Mr., Mrs., Ms.
- Abbreviated titles of respect such as: Dr., Mr., Mrs., Ms.
- Initials that stand for a person's name such as: T.J. Jones.
